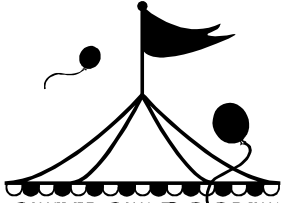

**Rain and severe flooding in Pakistan** have caused as many as 1,600 deaths, 2 million driven from their homes, and roads, bridges, and crop destroyed. Concern for the spread of waterborne illnesses and starvation is high as the crisis continues. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is responding to the emergency in collaboration with its partners on the ground in Pakistan.

Rain and flash floods continue in Pakistan, and some areas where floodwaters had receded were inundated again over the weekend. More than 14 million Pakistanis have been affected by the disaster.
